Caring and Safe School Environment

The staff at Kimberley/BAS is committed to creating a caring and safe learning environment for your child and we count on your collaboration

- Students are supervised by adults from 8:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.
- All visitors to the school (including parents) are requested to check in at the office.

Non-Prescription & Prescription Medication

No staff member is allowed to administer nonprescriptive medication to any student. If a prescription medication is requested to be administered during school hours, a form will be sent home for you to fill in. Depending on the age of the child and the circumstances, permission will be given to office staff who will then administer the medication. The medication must have a prescription with dosage, time, date and doctor's name on it and will be stored in the principal's office.

Scooters, Bikes and Skateboards

These items cannot be ridden on school property. We encourage all students to walk to school, as we have no space for storing scooters/skateboards. Bikes should be stored outside in the bike rack. A lock for your bike is strongly recommended. The school cannot be responsible for items that are lost or damaged. We advocate for the use of safety gear, including a helmet, if riding a bike, scooter or skateboard to school.

Parent Council

Greater parent involvement in education is one of the key strategies of the Ministry of Education to improve student achievement. Being on the School Council is one of the many ways to support this initiative.

The Parent Councils of both Kimberley and Beaches are made up of parents and teachers, where the goal is to act as an advisory body that supports activities that benefit the students in all areas of the Curriculum. This often involves fund-raising and parent input by way of recommendations to the principal or the Board of Education. The Parent Council meets monthly.

A child's MedicAlert identification can alert staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.
