EQAO...planning ahead...

This year our Grade 3 and 6 students are scheduled to complete EQAO testing from May 25th to June 4th. EQAO provides us with meaningful data by measuring our students' achievement in reading, writing and math in relation to Ontario Curriculum expectations. The objective and reliable assessment results are evidence that adds to the current knowledge about student learning and serves as an important tool for improvement at the individual. school, school board and provincial levels. EQAO helps build capacity for the appropriate use of data by providing resources that educators, parents, policy-makers and others in the education community can use to improve learning and teaching.

Please avoid booking appointments; trips; etc during these 2 weeks of EQAO testing.

As a parent, you can help your child prepare for EQAO testing by logging into <u>www.EQAO.com</u> and searching under the Parent Resources section. Being involved at home is a proven way to help ensure that your child is engaged in their learning!


Fostering a Strong Sense of Self

On Friday morning, March 6, fifty-five of our school choir's fifty-nine members piled on to a school bus en route to Winston Churchill Collegiate High School. We had been working hard on two songs since the beginning of January to perform at the festival. Two other schools were in our festival class. An adjudicator listened to our performances and then worked with us on the songs.

All three choirs sang a song chosen by the festival called Doraji. We were very proud of ourselves for singing this entire song in Korean. What a challenge that was! Our second song, which we chose, was an old folk song from Northern Ontario called, The Blackfly Song. It was great fun to sing! Just a week before festival, Lyra stepped in as conductor for this song and did a super job. Some comments on Doraji from the adjudicator included, "pleasant sound...loved vour last note....careful preparation of words, melody, and rhythm. Comments for The Blackfly Song included "lots of words-good for you!...a very good sense of ensemble...I loved your ending...What a lovely choir!" For many of our singers, this was their very first experience performing on stage in a large auditorium.
