Our community has been very generous in extending their support as the families adjust to their life in Canada. We recognize the ongoing challenges of embracing a new place to call home and count on our school community to continue their support. Many of you might have noticed the Arabic signs in our office, washrooms and classrooms. We also know that some of our students are learning basic Arabic phrases. It has been an exciting opportunity for all of us to expand our experiences and learn from each other.

Term 1 has gone by in a flash and the next three months will be very busy for the Kimberley and Beaches Alternative community. This year the Grade 5 and 6 students will have an opportunity to participate in an overnight learning excursion to the Island School. EQAO...planning ahead...

This year our **Grade 3 and 6** students are scheduled to complete EQAO testing from May to June 8th. EQAO provides us with meaningful data by measuring our students' achievement in reading, writing and math in relation to Ontario Curriculum expectations. The objective and reliable assessment results are evidence that adds to the current knowledge about student learning and serves as an important tool for improvement at the individual, school, school board and provincial levels. EQAO helps build capacity for the appropriate use of data by providing resources that educators, parents, policy-makers and others in the education community can use to improve learning and teaching.

Please avoid booking appointments; trips; etc during these 2 weeks of EQAO testing. As a parent, you can help your child prepare for EQAO testing by logging into www.EQAO.com and searching under the Parent Resources section. Being involved at home is a proven way to help ensure that your child is engaged in their learning!
