Students in grades 3 and 6 will be writing provincial assessments in Reading, Writing and Mathematics starting the last week of May. These tests come from the provincial Education Quality

and Accountability Office and are administered by grade 3 and 6 teachers. This year, the assessments will take place from <u>Monday, May</u> <u>25th to Thursday June 4th</u>. Once again, we remind parents that it is important that students attend school every day during the assessment. If possible, please try to arrange appointments outside of the testing period. We appreciate your cooperation.

As a parent, you can help your child prepare for EQAO testing by logging into <u>www.EQAO.com</u> and searching under the Parent Resources section. Being involved at home is a proven way to help ensure that your child is engaged in their learning!

Eco School Update

Thank you to all the Kimberley families that helped create four new raised garden beds at the front entrance of Kimberley/Beaches!



A big shout out goes to all the families that helped to make this happen! At least 20 volunteers showed up Saturday, and spent the afternoon creating four beautiful raised garden beds, a rotating compost container, and a large composting bin.



This was no small feat! Volunteers were hard at work for five hours cutting and drilling the 6 x 6 timbers, removing the grass and soil, leveling the earth, hammering rebar to secure the base timbers, hammering spikes to secure each level, and then moving yards of soil into newly built garden beds.

This phenomenal addition to our school was made possible by the members of The Eco Club, a group of dedicated parent volunteers from Kimberley and Beaches. They were able to secure a grant from Live Green

<u>Toronto, a program of the City</u> <u>of Toronto, and spent countless</u> hours calculating, pricing and sourcing all of the materials.



Thanks to the expertise and dedication of our volunteers, the project ran exceptionally smooth, and now provides a wonderful addition to the front entrance.



The gardens will now be filled with the vegetables that are growing in the indoor growing station located beside the library. Students and parent volunteers will nurture the gardens over the spring and summer, and harvest the bounty for use in our Snack Program.

A big thank you as well to Centre 55, for allowing us to use their parking lot and power to prep all the timbers for the garden beds.

Celebrating Our Amazing Crossing Guard

Lois Young is the Crossing Guard on the corner of Swanwick Avenue and Main Street outside Kimbereley School, and she has just completed 15 years of service on this crossing! On April 15 Lois, along with about 100 other crossing guards, was awarded a commemorative pin in a special ceremony to mark long service to the community, held at Toronto City Hall.



I wanted to find out more about what Lois does and how she feels about being honoured for her work, so I interviewed her.

Alia: How many commemorative pins for long service do you have?

Lois: "I have 3 from the Police Department, one for every 5 years on duty. Crossing Guards are part of the Police Department. We receive all our training and supplies from them. I also have many other commemorative pins I've earned over the years for different services, including Meals on Wheels and City of Toronto. I keep my 30 pins in a shadow box, and it's special to me because this is what shows: 'Hey – this is my life!' "

Alia: What was the award ceremony like? Did you meet the Mayor?

Lois: "Each Crossing Guard went up to receive their award and pin and have their picture taken with the officials. There were dignitaries who spoke and thanked us for the work we do. It was a happy occasion."



Alia: Do you like being a Crossing Guard? Lois: "I like it immensely!"

Alia: What do you like most about your job? Lois: "I like seeing the people every day, and knowing that I'm helping kids safely across the street."

Alia: What do you like least?

Lois: "I don't like it when I see infractions of the Highway Act, committed by motorists or pedestrians. I sometimes see people crossing the road between cars, being distracted by their phones while crossing, and drivers who are more interested in speed and personal convenience, and all of that can lead to accidents."

Alia: How do you motivate yourself to come to work in all types of weather, especially in the middle of winter when it's freezing?

Lois: "I just check the weather report every morning, and layer-up!"

Alia: What message do you have for the kids in the neighbourhood?

Lois: "Always play safe! Always follow the safety rules, wherever you are!"

Most of us students know Lois by name and say 'Hello' and 'Thank you' to her as she takes us safely over the road. Now I'm glad to say I know more about what she does, and I'm glad that she has received a big 'Thank You' not only from students and parents, but from the City of Toronto as well!


