EQAO...planning ahead...

This year our **Grade 3 and 6** students are scheduled to complete EQAO testing from May 21st to June 3rd. EQAO provides us with meaningful data by measuring our students' achievement in reading, writing and math in relation to Ontario Curriculum expectations. The objective and reliable assessment results are evidence that adds to the current knowledge about student learning and serves as an important tool for improvement at the individual, school, school board and provincial levels. EQAO helps build capacity for the appropriate use of data by providing resources that educators, parents, policy-makers and others in the education community can use to improve learning and teaching.

Please avoid booking appointments; trips; etc during these 2 weeks of EQAO testing. As a parent, you can help your child prepare for EQAO testing by logging into www.EQAO.com and searching under the Parent Resources section. Being involved at home is a proven way to help ensure that your child is engaged in their learning!

Earth Week

Starting Tuesday, April 23st, Kimberley/Beaches will be celebrating Earth Week. Each day we will show our support with a little friendly competition. Students will be asked to wear a specific colour to show their support. The class who wears each colour the most will get to keep the Kimberley/Beaches Cup (made out of recycled materials) in their room for the day. Following is a list of Earth Week events and day specific colours:

Tuesday, April 23rd: Plant a Garden Day - Brown! Ecoclub will be going to each class and helping each student to plant a vegetable seed to take home. The more we grow our own food the less we depend on vehicles to transport our food.

Wednesday, April 24th:

Kimberley/Beaches Earth Day - Green!

Please make every effort to have your child walk, bike or skateboard to school on this day. When we walk instead of drive, we help reduce air pollution.

Outdoor litterless lunch picnic, with lemonade stand and bake sale, followed by a yard clean up. Please bring your own cup and money to purchase lemonade and baked goods in support of our gardening initiatives. Please also bring your own gardening glove, mitten or winter glove so we don't have to use plastic ones to pick up garbage.

Thursday, April 25th: Save a Tree Day - Black! Our annual used book exchange will take place. Every child will be able to take home a used book that is new to them. By exchanging books we save trees from being cut down.

Friday, April 26th: Clean Water Day - Blue! To finish up our Earth Week we will be wearing blue to remind us not to waste water and to keep our water clean. Remember to be a Water Hero!

Donations are needed for Earth Week to be a success. Please drop off used books in the boxes in the fover outside of the gym starting the first week in April. donations of baked goods can be dropped off on the large table in the foyer on April 24th for our annual bake sale. Lastly, please send your child with a glove or mitten to pick up garbage on April 24th. In the past, we have actually created more garbage than we have collected due to handing out plastic gloves to each student. On Thursday, March 22, Room 203 welcomed




two visitors from the Royal Canadian Legion. They were Helen Pearce and Elsie Higgins, whose late husband was a Navy veteran from World War Two. They were

After I read L.M. Montgomery's EMILY OF NEW MOON, when I was twelve, I decided I wanted to be a writer. I often begin with characters and experiences from my own life, but I change them.

The best way to make your own writing better is to read as much as possible and write as much as possible! Then you will get naturally better over time. The way to describe things vividly is to use many precise details rather than being vague.

I hope you continue to read and write. Again, thanks for writing!
